*Notes.* Each year, consistent with directions of the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), we exclude from the initial cohort students who died or became permanently disabled, or who interrupted their education for military, religious, or foreign service. Students in the latter three categories who return to their education are added back into the cohort. In addition, beginning with the Fall 2008 entering cohort, the graduation rates are calculated based on a September to August graduation cycle (rather than the typical July-June cycle required by IPEDS and the CDS) so that each student's status as retained, graduated, or withdrawn can be unequivocally determined each year.
