*The Department of Communication and Media Studies at Fordham University, The Jesuit University of New York, invites applications for a full-time Lecturer position, to begin Fall semester 2022. This position will contribute to teaching in our undergraduate major in Digital Technologies and Emerging Media (DTEM) and our interdisciplinary program in New Media and Digital Design (NMDD). Providing administrative support for NMDD is also expected. Although the position will be based at our Lincoln Center campus, responsibilities involve potential teaching at the Rose Hill campus as well. Applications will be accepted until May 31, 2022, at 11:59 PM.*

## About the Position:

We are looking for a creative production-oriented instructor with expertise in the areas of video storytelling, digital production for new media, creative studio practice, data visualization (ideally from both qualitative and quantitative sources), and/or UX design. The ideal candidate will have field and professional knowledge in image, video, sound, web, hardware, and software; be entrepreneurial-minded with proven project management skills, particularly with creative and/or code-driven projects; be committed to mentoring and advising students; and have proven excellence in university teaching, including the ability to bring critical and public engagement into practical lectures, exercises, and assignments that culminate in applied project(s). In addition to academic advising, administrative responsibilities in the NMDD program could involve liaising with the departments of Computer Science, Visual Arts, and the Gabelli School of Business; representing the program at open houses and major fairs; leading or guiding instructional faculty on program policies, governance, and curriculum development; leading or consulting on the hiring of adjunct instructors; leading or consulting on course scheduling; and maintaining an online exhibition space of student Capstone Projects.
