POSITION DESCRIPTION

The Department is located on both campuses of Fordham University (Rose Hill and Lincoln Center), but this position will be based at the Rose Hill campus in the Bronx. The Department of Psychology offers doctoral degrees in Applied Developmental Psychology, Clinical Psychology, and Psychometric/Quantitative Psychology, along with Master's degree programs in Applied Psychological Methods and Clinical Research Methods. The primary responsibility for this position involves serving as the Head of the Fordham Community Mental Health Clinic – a small, community-based training clinic affiliated with the Department. This role also involves providing group and individual training and supervision to doctoral students in clinical psychology with a dedicated teaching load of 2 courses per semester.

REQUIREMENTS

Candidates must have earned a Ph.D. in clinical psychology, completed an APA- or CPA-approved internship, and be licensed in New York. Because this position involves supervising graduate students in clinical service delivery, as well as heading a community-based training clinic, a clinician experienced in providing supervision, preferably with expertise in teaching and training graduate students in empirically supported treatments, is strongly preferred. The ideal candidate will have at least 5 years of clinical experience (post-licensure) training and supervising clinical psychology graduate students, as well as undergraduate and graduate teaching experience. Familiarity with relevant software packages (e.g., Titanium) is also desirable. Fordham is an independent, Catholic University in the Jesuit tradition that welcomes applications from all backgrounds.
