

# PRELIMINARY UNDERGRADUATE PLACEMENT REPORT FOR 2012

## Office of Institutional Research

November 30, 2012

The following contains statistics on undergraduate career and school placement outcomes for 2011-2012. The report is divided in two sections: (1) outcomes for the graduating class of 2012 and (2) doctoral health professional school admissions and prestigious awards announced in 2011-2012 for student and graduates from all classes. All figures are preliminary because the Institutional Research Office compiled them before the Placement Survey ended, before the data were adjusted for differences in response rates between liberal arts and business graduate, and before it processed all supplementary data. The Office of Institutional Research expects to release the final report in February 2013.
