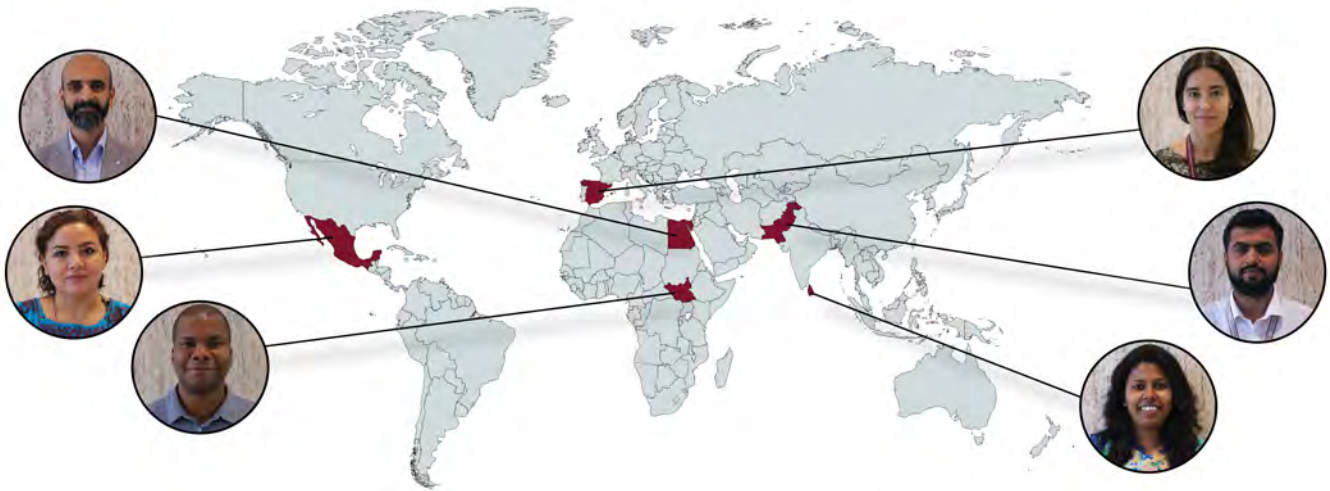

Course Details

4 Weeks. 200 Hours. 1 Diploma.

The **IDHA** is an intensive, multidisciplinary four week training program including more than 200 hours of lectures, presentations, debates, and group work. The course provides participants with both an academic and practical orientation to various aspects of humanitarian assistance including negotiations, management, psychology, communications, education, international law, civil/military relations, politics, and economics.
