

Campus Community

- 19% of incoming students are first-generation
- 21% of incoming students receive Pell Grants
- All 50 states represented and over 100 countries
- Over half self-identify as students of color

Affordability

- Admissions is need-blind; financial aid is needbased and full need.
- Over \$214 million awarded annually in grants and scholarships
- No loans are used to meet financial need.
- Families with income less than \$66,000 (and typical assets) have a \$0 parent contribution.
- Free tuition for student from families with income less than \$150,000 (and typical assets)

Access and Testing Policy

- Columbia is test-optional.
- Applicants who choose to provide tests may self-report their results; verified scores are only required once enrolling.
- If our application fee is a significant financial burden, we will simply waive it.

Admission Policies and Updates

- The Class of 2027 was the third largest in our history, with more than 2,400 students. The Class of 2027 also was our most diverse with more than 48% domestic students of color and 7.6% international students. The new Rams hailed from 45 states, 55 countries, and all five boroughs of New York City. More than 500 students in the incoming class are from New York City, including 125 students from the Bronx.
 - We have extended our test-optional pilot through Fall 2025 (Admission, Financial Aid, Scholarships and Special Programs). Learn more at: fordham.edu/testoptional
 - We have added EDII to our application options with a January 3rd deadline.
 - **Optional Questions** on the Common Application have been expanded. Students now have a choice of three (3) instead of only one (1) option.
 - We continue to offer on campus visitation opportunities along with complementary virtual programming. We are offering more than 700 in person and virtual events this fall.
 - College Search and FAFSA Simplification websites are available at Fordham.edu.
 - Stay tuned for an expansion of our summer programs for high school students!



- Applies to Fall 2023, Spring 2024, Summer 2024, Fall 2024, Spring 2025 semesters
