LIFE IN GRANADA

Fordham in Granada is based at Cultural Experiences Abroad Center (CEA CAPA) and the University of Granada, the third largest university in Spain. The University of Granada hosts a diverse student population and extensive history - dating back to 1531 when Emperor Charles V founded the institution on the site of the previous Arab university.

Granada, a UNESCO recognized World Heritage Site and a City of Literature, is one of the most beautiful cities in Spain and the world. Granada is also the hometown of Federico García Lorca and the center for flamenco culture. The Alhambra Palace, the Sacromonte and Albayzín neighborhoods, the Cathedral and the numerous Baroque churches of the city are a testament of the rich past which continues to thrive through its vibrant university community.

University Facilities

As enrolled students at the University of Granada and Centro de Lenguas Modernas, students have access to the university's facilities including libraries, audiovisual media centers, multimedia classrooms, and the Cultural Experiences Abroad (CEA CAPA) office. Students are offered individualized tutoring and can expect their academic progress to be supported by program staff. Workshops on creative writing, film editing, cooking, social service, fitness, and well as conversation exchanges and other opportunities are available.

Internships & Volunteering

Fordham in Granada offers the opportunity to enroll in for-credit internships administered by Cultural Experiences Abroad (CEA CAPA) in partnership with local organizations in the fields of Education, Non-Profit Administration, Journalism, and Teaching. Internships require the completion of two hours of seminar instruction and 40 immersion hours at a placement site. Internships are available at all levels of Spanish proficiency.

Students can also take advantage of volunteering opportunities, available at all levels of Spanish proficiency, with a variety of organizations. Additional information about volunteering opportunities will be reviewed once students arrive in Granada. Housing

Students in the Fordham in Granada program will have the opportunity to choose between a homestay or student residence hall living arrangement. In a homestay, students will live with a Granada family for the semester in an immersive experience. Amenities, including linens, three meals a day seven days a week, laundry, and wifi are included. Homestay families are carefully selected by Cultural Experiences Abroad (CEA CAPA).

In a residence hall, students will be part of a larger study abroad community, living in a building with other study abroad and University of Granada students. Amenities, including linens, three meals a day six days a week, laundry, and wifi are included. In both accommodation types, students typically share a bedroom with another program participant and will have access to additional support through CEA CAPA staff.

HOW TO APPLY

Preparation to study abroad can never begin too early. Visit our office or your home school's study abroad office, speak with your academic advisors, and research opportunities online. Applications are completed online in the Study Abroad Portal and are reviewed on a rolling basis.

Cost

Tuition: Tuition is the same as Fordham University per-semester tuition or per-credit tuition for summer.

Housing: Participants will pay a housing fee that will cover the cost of housing during the program. Program Fee: Participants will pay a program fee that will cover health insurance while abroad, co-curricular activities, and orientation.

Other Fees: Study Abroad Fee, General Fee, Technology Fee, and Fordham Study Abroad Application Fee will be charged to participants.

Financial Aid

Given the student's continuing eligibility, all Fordham financial aid will be portable except roomspecifc aid, work-study and Metro Grants.
