
Fordham in Granada is based at Cultural Experiences Abroad (CEA/CAPA) and the University of Granada, the third largest university in Spain. The University of Granada hosts a diverse student population and extensive history - dating back to 1531 when Emperor Charles V founded the institution on the site of the previous Arab university.

Granada, a UNESCO recognized World Heritage Site and a City of Literature, is one of the most beautiful cities in Spain and the world. Granada is also the hometown of Federico García Lorca and the center for flamenco culture. The Alhambra Palace, the Sacromonte and Albayzín neighborhoods, the Cathedral and the numerous Baroque churches of the city are a testament of the rich past which continues to thrive through its vibrant university community.



SHORT-TERM PROGRAMS

Short-term study abroad programs typically range from two to four weeks allowing students who would otherwise be unable to commit to a semester or full-year overseas an opportunity to incorporate a global experience into their education. Study abroad staff work with Fordham faculty to develop exciting and immersive courses with a specific host city and academic theme in mind. 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FORDHAM IN LONDON

Liberal Arts

This program offers students the opportunity to take courses at the Fordham London Centre and the option to take one module (course) at one of three universities: Queen Mary University London (fall only), City, University London, or the University of Westminster. Programs at Fordham London are available during the Fall and Spring terms after their first semester sophomore year. Core and major courses are available in a variety of subjects including Art History, Communications and Media Studies, Economics, English, Film and Television, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Theatre, and Theology and allow students to continue with their requirements while incorporating British and European perspectives.

Gabelli School of Business

This program offers students the opportunity to take core and major courses at the Fordham London Centre, located a short walk from the City of London, a European financial hub. Courses in Accounting and Taxation, Law and Ethics, Business Communications and Media Management, Finance and Business Economics, and Marketing are available and allow students to continue with their requirements while opening their eves to new business practices and ideas.

Direct Enrollment Programs

Direct Enrollment programs provide students an immersive study abroad experience. Students in these programs live and study alongside degree-seeking students at esteemed university partners such as Oxford University, Sciences Po Reims, University of Sydney, Singapore Management University, and many others. Fordham offers direct enrollments at both English-taught universities and immersive language programs in a number of countries. Fordham's Exchange Programs include direct enrollments at universities in Argentina, Australia, Austria, Brazil, China, Colombia, France, Germany, Ireland, Italy, Mexico, The Netherlands, Peru, The Philippines, South Korea, and Spain. These programs are well-suited to motivated, independent, and adaptable students who are seeking a culturally and academically immersive study abroad experience.

Island Programs

Island Programs provide students the opportunity to study abroad at centers that replicate the American university experience and are specifically designed to cater to the needs of American study abroad students. Students enrolled in these programs will live and study with other study abroad students, and attend courses where teaching and assessment are comparable to those at American universities. Unless otherwise noted, instruction is in English but a language class may be required in locations whose host language is not English.

Some island programs partner with local universities, allowing study abroad students to enroll in certain local university classes alongside local students. Participants are exposed to teaching and assessment methods that may differ from those at American universities. Unless otherwise noted, these classes are taught in the language of the host country. These unique programs are called "Hybrid" in our catalog.

Special Focus Programs

Special Focus Programs integrate a central academic subject, thematic topic, experiential learning, service opportunity, or internship that permeates the student experience. These programs provide students who are interested in a special focus the opportunity to be immersed in that topic for their term abroad. These programs may offer extensive field-based work, independent research, service learning, or professional internships.

HOW TO APPLY

Cost/Financial Aid

Fordham in London, Fordham in Granada, Exchange, and Partner Programs' tuition is the same as traditional undergraduate per-term Fordham tuition in NY. Additional fees that cover the cost of housing, insurance, orientation, co-curricular activities, the Study Abroad Fee, Technology Fee, General Fee, and Insurance Fee will be charged. Given the student's continuing eligibility, all Fordham financial aid will be portable for approved study abroad programs except room-specific aid and work-study. Tuition Remission. Tuition Exchange, and FACHEX can be applied to the cost for Fordham in London, Fordham in Granada, and Exchange Programs only. Need-based metro grants for commuting students are portable for approved study abroad programs, but please consult with the Office of Student Financial Services to determine Metro Grant portability.

For all study abroad programs, as long as eligibility requirements are met, students eligible for a Pell Grant, a New York State TAP grant or student loans can apply this aid toward their study abroad charges.
