Jake Schefer, MSW Candidate

Jake Schefer was born in New York City and grew up in Westchester County. He is currently getting his MSW at Fordham University. He is focusing his social work practice on macro social work, particularly community organizing and advocacy, within immigrant communities. His current field placement is at Afrikana, a grassroots community-based organization that helps immigrants, primarily black Muslim asylum seekers from West Africa, start their new lives in New York City. Outside of work and school, he is a community organizer and advocate in his community for Jewish Voice for Peace, an organization of Jews fighting for Palestinian liberation. He is also working on a research project and advocacy campaign with some of his colleagues to study and call out the negative outcomes of the “Troubled Teen Industry,” a privatized unregulated industry purporting to help “troubled youth” while often doing the opposite.

Attiya Latif is a Muslim American advocate and organizer dedicated to human rights, social justice, and digital activism. As the Senior Digital Organizing Specialist at the ACLU, they lead digital mobilization to defend civil liberties and expand grassroots power. Previously, Attiya was a Senior Campaigner and Organizer at Amnesty International USA, where they led the Sudan Spotlight Campaign and co-led the Gaza Crisis and Arizona Abortion Access campaigns. Their grassroots strategies mobilized thousands across New York and Connecticut on gun violence prevention, mass surveillance, and immigrant rights, contributing to key legislative victories, including a Connecticut assault weapons ban and \$32 million for violence intervention programs. Attiya holds an M.St. in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies from the University of Oxford and an M.Sc. in Migration, Mobility, and Development Studies from SOAS University of London.

Cass Severe, MSW Candidate Meet Her At The Gate

Cass Severe is a dedicated advocate, speaker, and change agent committed to supporting justice-impacted women. As the founder of Meet Her At The Gate (MHATG), she leads a nationally recognized reentry initiative that provides pre-entry support and community-based care for women transitioning from incarceration.

Having faced the challenges of reentry herself, Cass transformed her experiences into a mission, partnering with the New Jersey Department of Corrections to lead pre-release programs and personally meet women upon their release. She has also served as an Executive Director for an anti-violence nonprofit, working to ensure reentry services are intentional and sustainable.

Currently pursuing her Master of Social Work (MSW) at Monmouth University, Cass is shaping policies that support system-impacted individuals. She serves on the Board of Trustees for the facility where she was once incarcerated, a testament to her resilience and leadership.

A sought-after speaker, Cass has shared her story on national platforms like the Woman Evolve Tour, where she secured a \$10,000 investment in MHATG. She also speaks on resilience and justice reform on the I Love Me More podcast.

Cass believes in self-care as a radical act of resistance, embracing rest, joy, and community. Her motto, "Book flights, not feelings," reflects her commitment to living with purpose while breaking cycles and empowering others.

Darryl Speights is a Substance Abuse Counselor and dedicated Community Advocate based in Long Branch, New Jersey. As an outpatient counselor at New Hope IBHC, he provides comprehensive, individualized support for adolescents, adults, and families navigating substance use. His mission is driven by a deep commitment to empowering adolescents, equipping them with the resilience, self-sufficiency, and essential resources needed to overcome life's challenges.

He integrates trauma-informed care, mindfulness practices, and social-emotional learning into his therapeutic approach, promoting holistic healing and sustained recovery. Darryl also founded Building A Better You, LLC, a consulting firm dedicated to creating programs focused on resilience-building, empowerment, and personal growth. Notable programs he has developed include Resilient Attitudes and Living, Next Step Wellness Program, and Financial Literacy for Recovery, each designed to equip young individuals and their caregivers with practical tools for success.

Deeply rooted in community engagement, Darryl serves in multiple influential roles, including a board member for the Long Branch Little League, a member of the Long Branch Zoning Board of Adjustment, an active participant on the city's Green Team promoting environmental justice and climate resilience, and a board member of the New Jersey Library Association dedicated to educational enrichment.

His advocacy extends into environmental justice through his consulting work with Monmouth University's Urban Coast Institute (UCI), focusing on community engagement to address flooding and resilience. Darryl is committed to ensuring marginalized voices are heard, advocating for inclusive solutions, and serving as a bridge between local government and the community.

Additionally, Darryl co-facilitates CREATE, an innovative afterschool workshop series hosted by the Long Branch Arts & Cultural Center. CREATE will provide teens with a supportive space to explore creativity, self-expression, and community building. Recently, Darryl's dedication to youth advocacy, community resilience, and social justice was formally recognized when he received an Honoree acknowledgment from New Jersey Senator Gopal and Assemblywoman Donlon and Peterpaul, further highlighting his influential contributions and unwavering commitment to uplifting the voices and opportunities of underserved youth and families in his community.

Fizza Saghir is a PhD student, researcher, adjunct professor, and international social worker at the University of Connecticut School of Social Work. Her research interests and areas of work include human rights, forced migration, war and politics, international social work, refugee rights, Islamophobia, and peacebuilding. Her current projects include research related to radical community organizing at a populist moment across the globe, Ukrainian refugees receiving temporary shelter in Bulgaria, climate change crisis and difference in perceptions of youth from Global North and Global South, understanding alternative approaches to analysis of hate crimes policy with respect to Islamophobia in the US, and a critical analysis of economic sanctions on Afghanistan, focusing on right to health.

She has been teaching multiple courses to MSW and BSW students including macro foundation practice, social welfare policy, and Holocaust and genocides and implications for social work practice. She also teaches several topics in international social work and human rights, as a guest lecturer. She continues to work with different war and genocide-survivors and forcibly displaced refugee populations, globally such as Karen refugees from Myanmar, Ukrainian refugees in Bulgaria, and Afghan and Rohingya refugees settled in India. Previously, as Chief Minister's Fellow in the Government of Delhi, she has handled significant managerial responsibilities in Delhi Government's flagship projects covering multiple dimensions of child rights—education, health, violence, and abuse. From training and capacity-building of adolescents in the urban slums to advocacy for rights of domestic workers and from working on sexual and gender-based violence to engaging in community awareness on child abuse, she has experience of working with several vulnerable populations and marginalized Communities.

Dr. Siva Mathiyazhagan is a Research Assistant Professor at the School of Social Policy and Practice and Co-Director of the SAFE Lab at the University of Pennsylvania. He is a Senior Fellow at the Leonard Davis Institute of Health Economics at the University of Pennsylvania and a Pradeep Mehendiratta Fellow (2025-26) at the American Institute of Indian Studies. Dr. Mathiyazhagan is a global tech social work researcher and community practitioner. He co-designs and develops community-centered AI-supported technology products and tools for youth well-being and development. He co-creates tech social work policies and ethical considerations for Artificial Intelligence (AI), Machine Learning (ML), and Metaverse for social equity and just and equitable Web3. Dr. Mathiyazhagan deploys a hybrid version of qualitative indigenous research methodologies and Contextual Analysis of Social Media (CASM) to understand youth expressions on social media in native/regional/hyper-local languages to prevent emotional extremisms. Dr. Mathiyazhagan is the Founder-Director of the youth-led non-profit Trust for Youth and Child Leadership (TYCL) International, based in Asia and the Americas. Dr. Mathiyazhagan serves as a TYCL representative to the United Nations. Dr. Mathiyazhagan was an RSM Assembly Fellow (2022-23) and faculty associate at the Berkman Klein Center for Internet & Society, Harvard University. Dr. Mathiyazhagan was a postdoctoral research scientist and lecturer at the School of Social Work at Columbia University.
